International Student Enrollment at the University of Connecticut

- ISSS extremely understaffed
- Every semester, ISSS/visa compliance officers assist the Federal government several times to ensure students are enrolled and active
- Recently hired full-time DSO (Designated School Official) international student advisor for Stamford Campus
- Plans to create an Intercultural Competence mid-level staff position in ISSS: role to reach out to students, work with campuses, help with mental health issues

The Visa Compliance Fee will only be charged to visa holders who are sponsored by UCONN. Fulbright scholars' visas are sponsored by the Fulbright Commission, not by UCONN. So no fees will be charged to them. Scholarship recipients vary. It depends on their scholarship source and whether UCONN sponsor their visas. This fee is waived for the Graduate Assistants, as per university contract negotiation with the UAW.

UConn's largest foreign student population: mainland China, India, Iran (primarily Engineering, Business School) – recommendation for students/faculty from Iran not to leave the country
