1. Review of past minutes (November 9, 2018) postponed.

2. Update on action items from last meeting

A. Matt Yates, Interim Director UCONN Global Education Abroad, and Laura Hills, Interim Associate Director, met with the committee. M. Yates indicated that there were 1,017 students involved in Global Abroad programs for credit during last academic year. He outlined three types of programs:

1. UCONN programs (67/yr (69%) of students). UCONN faculty are involved in these, and 46 are faculty lead. They create a program budget and bill the students.

2. Exchange programs (18% of students). These are a semester or year abroad through an agreement with UCONN. There are 49 programs. Students also come to UCONN on an equal basis averaged over a period of time. These include Universitas21 and the Germany program. Students pay UCONN to do an exchange.

3. Third-Party Options (13% of students). UCONN does not have agreements with these, but are attempting to get agreements where courses align with UCONN's. There are 22 agreements and 264 different programs that do not have agreements of 286 total. Beginning summer 2018, Gloabal Abroad does not allow petition to any institution.
